Promote High Academic Standards

- an open-access IB program to B-CC
- technology and materials needs for the AP and IB programs
- professional grants for teachers to receive AP and IB training

Examples: IB Expo, software subscriptions (IB's ManageBAC and Questia, Science's Quest); Writer's Workshop; Poetry Residency; Science Fair; Journalism and Media Literacy Workshop; science, social studies, and IB program textbooks; department equipment (Music's bass and drum set, Art's potter's wheel); materials for a new anthropology/forensics course; professional development funds for teachers training in new AP courses at B-CC (Comparative Government, Environmental Science, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, and Studio Art).

Support Success for All Students

- encourage and support students striving to achieve in the most demanding courses
- challenge and support all students to reach their potential

Examples: TAP (afterschool academic support for all students at all levels); pre IB/AP Summer Program; Summer Math Institute (for students moving up to the Honors level); 9th and 10th Grade Summer Academy program; English HSA Lunch Bunch; BRAG (mentoring for at-risk students); College Essay Writing Summer Workshop; Skills for Success; Minority Scholars Program; ESOL students enrichment activities; ESOL parent classes; Computer Labs; Language Lab; Cyber Café.

Open Doors to College

 guidance and support for students who are first-generation college bound to ensure that all students are aware of the posthigh school opportunities available to them and of what is required of them to take advantage of those opportunities.

Examples: College and Career Connections (summer mentoring program for rising 11th and 12th graders); College Tracks; B-CC Community Scholarship Fund; college visits for students in the ESOL program, the Minority Scholars Program, and the Girls Leadership Group.

Help Attract and Retain Highest-Quality Teachers and Staff

 provide professional development grants for teachers to attend conferences and training programs to gain skills and access to the latest research in their fields
